- 2. WCFRS gave a \$300.00 donation to the Ability Garden.



March in the Garden By: Bob Knerr

Finish any tasks noted in the February newsletter that you have not yet completed. Pruning of the roses and cleaning out of all old fallen leaves in the beds should be done

and the first feeding of 10-10-10 or other inorganic fertilizer completed.

Spray every 7-10 days with both a contact (Mancozeb) and systemic (Honor Guard) fungicide.

Mulch the beds to keep down weeds and to keep the roots cool in the summer.

Water weekly - 5-6 gallons per bush if it has not rained.

Weed when necessary.
